Partial Certificate of Occupancy (CO) Applicant's Pre-Approval Checklist Adopted: 12/08/2017

Step 1

Submit a written request from the owner or owner's agent and projects design professional in responsible charge for a Partial Certificate of Occupancy. This request will be reviewed and approved by the Inspections or Department Director.

Step 2,

Resolve all key development issues. The following is a list of potential issues that could prevent the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy until resolved. This list is not exhaustive:

Finalization of all on-site permits (and conditions of approvals), such as fire, site, civil, and
building (HVAC, electric, plumbing, subsurface, and signs).
Completion of all off-site improvements, including the removal and
repairs of street lights and signs.
Resolution of all project holds (including fees and taxes)
Completion of work as required and referenced in the construction
management plan.
Submittal and acceptance by the City's Department of Public Works
(sewer, grease trap)
Completion and submittal of required State Fire Marshal permitting
Completion and submittal of required Health Inspection requirements
Submittal of satisfactory Final Statement of Special Inspections
Code-required fire and life/safety systems, i.e., sprinklers, fire alarms, smoke detectors, fire rated
floor systems, duct, shafts, and penetrations, elevators, exit illumination, exits and exit stairways,
must be in place and functional.
Accessibility requirements must be in complete compliance to, throughout, and from the area
under consideration.
Parking must be available including accessible spaces.
No crane work or overhead lifting above floor(s) of occupancy
Other issues pursuant to field or permit conditions.

Step 3

Complete final inspections and request issuance of a Partial Certificate of Occupancy.

Please note the issuance of a Partial Certificate of Occupancy shall not be construed as a dismissal of a violation of City of Portland codes or ordinances.
