Re: Brighton Avenue Sewer Separation Project

Dear Resident:

District 3 City Councilor Brian Batson and the Portland Department of Public Works would like to invite you to a neighborhood meeting to review the design of the above referenced project. A map at the end of this notice will assist in defining the project boundaries. This project is being completed to help the City with their efforts to prevent Combined Sewer Overflows (CSO) into the Fore River Estuary and to comply with the City's long term control plan to mitigate CSO activity throughout the City.

The meeting is scheduled to be held in the Rowe School Cafeteria on **Wednesday November 7, 2018 at 6:00 PM**. The meeting should last about an hour. Please join us to receive a verbal description of what the project intends to achieve.

This project will separate the existing combined sewer in the street to a separate sanitary sewer and stormwater drain. This separation will be accomplished by installing new storm drains starting in Brighton Avenue from Lomond Street to Dorset Street, continuing down Rowe Avenue and turning down Meriline Avenue to discharge into a wetland at the end of the street. The project will be comprised of the following components: new storm drain and storm drain laterals to the property line if requested and approved, and new catch basins and drain manholes. The Portland Water District will also be renewing their water main in Brighton Avenue from Devon Street to Wessex Street as part of the project.

I have attached a brief questionnaire which I would appreciate being filled out. Please let us know if you have a sump pump, internal roof drains or related storm drainage issues. The City may install a storm drain lateral which could be used to separate your roof drains or sump pump from the City's sanitary sewer if it is currently connected. You may either bring it with you to the meeting or send it to me at Public Works.

I would also like to take this opportunity to advise you to coordinate, prior to the work on this street, any underground utility work within the street right-of-way (either repairs, changes, or connections) which will affect your property.

The principal types of utility work which concern us are outlined below:


- a) termination of natural gas service
- b) installation of natural gas service
- c) repair or replacement of sanitary sewer building connections
- d) repair or replacement of storm water drain building connections
- e) construction of a new building or structure resulting in the need to connect to all utilities
- f) replacement of water service
- g) installation of water fire service

- h) in areas of subdivisions within the City, served by a total underground utility system, all utility connections (gas, power, telephone, public cable, etc.) would be involved.

We look forward to meeting with you to discuss this project. If you are unable to attend the meeting please feel free to send written comments with a neighbor or mail them to myself. 
